### **Special Speaker Subject: Pervious Surfaces**

#### **Scotty Martin with Scotts Concrete: Subject Green Home project**

Mr. Martin spoke about pervious concrete pavement systems. The typical mix and design materials, the benefits of pervious pavement; including benefits to the environment, the economical benefits, and that it mitigates first flush pollutants, it keeps stormwater on site, protects trees, retains more water and has natural evaporation. #### **Special Speaker: Ben Evers with Southwest Stone Pavestone: Subject Pavers.**

Mr. Evers brought examples of interlocking concrete pavers from ICP Industries made mostly of concrete that have the ability to move and freeze and thaw without breakage. Permeable pavers are thicker and they are made with notches that allow fine sand to flow through. It is advantageous to combine permeable pavement with rain gardens for full effectiveness. Pavers will soak in 18-24 inches of water per hour. Can handle snow plows and semi trucks if base is installed correctly.
